



Library Resources Now Available in BlackBoard

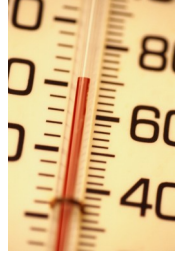

Readex's African American Newspapers

We are pleased to announce that the library has purchased a subscription to Readex's [African American Newspapers, 1827-1998](#). Chronicling a century and a half of the African American experience, *African American Newspapers, 1827-1998* features more than 270 newspapers from 35 states. These newspapers—including many rare and historically significant 19th and 20th-century titles—offer wide-ranging coverage of African American history, culture and daily life. This collection will complement our earlier subscription to Proquest's [Historical Black Newspapers](#).

The newspapers can be searched separately, as a group, or as part of [America's Historical Newspapers, 1690-1922](#), also from Readex.

RefWorks

Use [RefWorks](#) to create, organize, and store bibliographic references. References can be imported from ALEX (the library catalog) and most other databases, or entered manually one-by-one. The references can be formatted for bibliographies in many style formats (e.g., APA, MLA, Chicago Manual of Style, etc.).
