Biology: Sunday Afternoon; Tues and Thursday 4-6; Every Night.

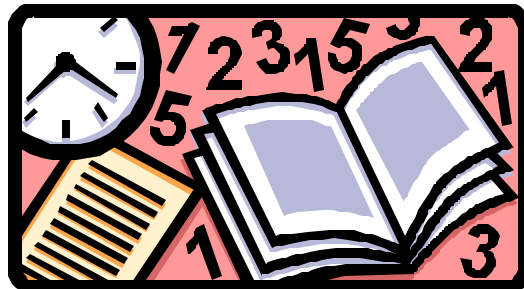
Chemistry: (Organic) Sunday Afternoon; Tuesday and Thursday 4-6; Every Night

Study Tips: Note-Taking 101

For more efficient note-taking:

1. Keep your notes simple—an outline or summary of the lectures or readings.
2. Develop your own “shorthand.” Use different colors of pen for different ideas and emphases.
3. Don't over-highlight!
4. As you take notes, use the margins of the page to write notes to yourself, with questions for the Professor, or for looking up later.
5. For future reference, number your pages, and put date and topic at the top of each page.
